# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

## Background

Visionary Landscapes: The Electronic Literature Organization 2008 Conference was co-hosted by Drs. Dene Grigar and John Barber from the Digital Technology and Culture Program at Washington State University Vancouver (WSUV).

Conference presentations took place on the WSUV campus from Friday, May 30 – Sunday, June 1, 2008. Media art exhibits ran simultaneously at three venues in the Vancouver area: the Firstenberg Student Commons on the WSUV campus, at North Bank Artists Gallery, and at Clark College.

The conference met its budget of approximately \$25,000.

## Highlights

- Attendees included 121 media artists and scholars from 17 different countries, including Korea, Australia, Brazil, the UK, Canada, Norway, Sweden, Spain, France, Germany, and Portugal.
- 74 attendees gave papers at the conference, and 36 exhibited their art at the media art show.
- Scholars attending the conference hail from top Tier One research institutions in the US, including MIT, Brown U, Stanford U, Yale U, University of Texas, Georgia Tech, UCLA, USC, Purdue, and U of Washington, as well as from international research labs and centers like the Laboratoire NT2 (Canada), the Hermeneia Research Group (Spain), Media Upheavals (Germany), and Centre Benjamin Franklin (France), and libraries like the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Library, the Dodd Research Center, the Harry Ransom Center for the Humanities, and the New York State Archives.
- 149 artists submitted art to the Media Arts Show; of these, 40 artists were selected for the exhibition and 10 received bursaries awards of \$500 each.
- 86 participants were not current ELO members and contributed to \$4040 in membership revenue.
- Total revenue for conference registration and membership was \$21131.65; total profit for the event was \$2546.58.
- The event was featured on the front page of the *Columbian* newspaper and has been publicized in electronic media like news websites, YouTube, blogs, Twitter, and Flickr.
- It provided close to \$150,000 in economic revenue for local area hotels, food establishments, transportation companies, and business centers.
- Over \$11,000 of kind support was provided from the Apple Corporation, Starbucks, McGraw-Hill Publishers, and FedEx/Kinko's, and Clark College.
